We believe it is of paramount importance that every child, adolescent and adult is in a safe environment free of all bullying, discrimination, and abuse.

What

Canada Soccer has laid out clear priorities for Clubs to strive to achieve, based on their capacity and resources.

Priorities

Code of Conduct

Cochrane Wolves Football Club has a code of conduct that is shared and signed by every participant (player, parent, coach, volunteer) in the organization.

Policies

Cochrane Wolves Football Club has guidelines for Appropriate/Inappropriate Conduct between adults/adolescents and children. The Organization has a policy outlining what to do if you witness inappropriate conduct. The Appropriate/Inappropriate Conduct Guidelines and what to do if you witness inappropriate conduct are shared with Coaches, Team Personnel, and Parents.

Commit to Kids

Cochrane Wolves Football Club has at least one individual who has completed the Commit to Kids (Matt Thomas) who is the organizations Primary Liaison.

Responsible Coaching Movement

- 1. Rule of Two Policy: **Club has Policy.**
- 2. Screening: All Club Coaches & Volunteers who are engaged in on-field activities must complete and clear a CRC/E-PIC.
- 3. Respect Training: All Club Coaches & Volunteers who are engaged in on-field activities must complete RIS Training.
- 4. Ethics Training: All Club Coaches & Volunteers who are engaged in on-field activities must complete Ethics Training.
- 5. Anti-Doping: At least one (1) individual at the Club must have completed the CCES Anti-Doping Course.
- 6. Injury and Return to Play: Club is working towards an injury and return to play policy.
- 7. Facility and Equipment Safety: Club is working towards facility and equipment safety policy.
- 8. RIS & Activity Leader: Club has at least one (1) individual who has RIS Activity Leader training.

Summary

Cochrane Wolves FC is working towards the final missing policies that will ensure the Club is 100% compliant with the National Youth Soccer Licensing requirements. The Club has recently hired a Full-Time Director of Coaching who is responsible for ensuring all coaches are meeting the standards required by Canada Soccer to provide a safe environment for all its members.
